The User Guide

Welcome to the Kaiser Permanente Clinical Trainer Skills Course! This User Guide is provided in order to help you better understand the overall goals of the training and to also help you quickly register for the class and start reviewing modules. In addition, at the end of the User Guide you will find examples of critical thinking activities that you can use with your learners when working face to face. Also provided is information on how to facilitate this course with a team of clinical trainers.

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About the Training

This four hour training will review and highlight the role of the clinical trainer as it relates to educational and performance based perspectives. The course is structured to support both individuals and teams by allowing learners to review specific topics at their own pace and interest.

This course is divided into 4 modules which should take you about an hour each to complete.

Each module is further subdivided into a series of individual lessons. A certificate of completion is provided for each of the four modules. However, you must complete every lesson in the module before the module's certificate of completion becomes available for download.

The topics discussed in the lessons include best practices, learning theories, assessment strategies, communication techniques, cultural diversity and the mentoring process. The accompanying user guide provides a more detailed overview of the training, along with information on how to access the online materials and suggestions on how to facilitate this course with a team of clinical trainers.

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NOTE:

- This training is composed of multimedia content, so the use of headphones is advised;
- We recommend using a minimum of Internet Explore 9, or the most recent version of Chrome or Firefox;
- The current deployment of this training is not supported on iOS devices; however other mobile platforms are supported;
- Lastly, because linked content is sometimes directed to open in a new browser window or tab, it is important to make sure that you browser's popup blocker is turned off.

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Logging In for the First Time

Follow the steps below to login and enroll in the Clinical Trainer Skills Course. Note: This course may be accessed outside of the Kaiser

Permanente intranet.

Step 1.

To log in for the first time, please go to the school learning management system page at kpscholar.com.




Then click the "create new account" button found on the left side of the screen in the "User login" box.

An message containing your temporary password will be sent to your email address.




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
Step 4.


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Navigating Through the Course

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Facilitator Resources

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Strategies for Promoting Critical Thinking

The concept of critical thinking is briefly addressed in the above modules through the discussion of scenario based learning and the learning environment. However, based on feedback from, and continued request by clinical trainers, it is apparent that critical thinking remains of great importance to the clinical education process. To this end we have presented a more detailed discussion of critical thinking here and also linked to additional resources to help the preceptor.

Defining Critical Thinking

To begin with, let's look at a definition of *critical thinking* as provided by <u>Facione</u>: Critical thinking is defined as "a purposeful self-regulatory judgment which results in interpretation, analysis, evaluation, and inference, as well as explanation of the evidential, conceptual, methodological, criterioogical, or contextual considerations upon which that judgment is based. Critical thinking is essential as a tool of inquiry."

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Facione goes on to explain the ideal critical thinker as one who is "habitually inquisitive, well-informed, trustful of reason, open-minded in evaluation, honest in facing personal biases, prudent in making judgments, willing to reconsider, clear about issues, orderly in



complex matters, diligent in seeking relevant information, reasonable in the selection of criteria, focused in inquiry and persistent in seeking results which are as precise as the subject and the circumstances of inquiry permit."

From this definition it becomes clear that critical thinking is not just a skill, but is also a personality trait and an attitude. The question remains though: What is the best strategy to promote the skill of critical thinking in the clinical environment? Provided here are links to articles that can help clinical instructors formulate critical thinking best practices and strategies of their own.
